

## Bernards Heath Infant School Pupil Premium Grant Report:

Academic Year: April 2016 to April 2017

The Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) is a Government initiative designed to narrow the attainment gap between economically disadvantaged pupils and their peers. The additional funding is allocated to the school to provide support for children from low income families to ensure they make good progress and achieve the expected attainment.

In 2016/2017 Bernards Heath Infant and Nursery School was funded for pupil premium and Looked After Children.

<p><b>Raising attainment</b> <b>£10,717</b> To raise attainment and accelerate progress of pupils therefore narrowing the gap between disadvantaged pupils and their peers.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>1:1 tuition in reading, writing or maths for some of those at risk of not reaching their end of year/KS targets</li></ul>	<p>I have worked on specific English and Maths targets from ASPs. This has included number, counting, addition, subtraction and solving simple problems independently. As a result of consistent practice I have seen an increase in self-belief and now one child can count in 2s and 10s independently and in 5's with very very little support! The child was very smiley as they recognised that this was an achievement! The child's confidence has grown over the weeks with problem solving and they are starting to become a lot more independent at finding the answer. Some verbal guidance is sometimes needed but often after a couple of attempts they can apply the method independently.</p> <p>Parents are on board and keen for the tuition to continue. I send some half termly 'mini reports' noting achievements so that parents can consistently support at home.</p>



<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Breakfast Club</li> <li>• Family Support Worker</li> </ul>	<p>to ensure they are well prepared and feeling confident to start each day at school.</p> <p>Providing places at breakfast club means that children are ready to start their school day, with the rest of their class, on time every day</p> <p>A contribution to the Family Worker Service means we can access support for our families and buy in traded services including counselling, play therapy and friendship groups.</p>
<p><b>Enrichment</b> <b>£674.29</b></p> <p>To maximise access to experiences that widen children's knowledge and skills for life.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cost of school visits as appropriate</li> <li>• Swimming Lessons</li> <li>• Science Activity Club</li> <li>• Resources for the summer holiday</li> </ul>	<p>Children have accompanied their classes on visits to support learning throughout the year. In addition they have participated in singing at the Christmas Market along with other groups from their community.</p> <p>Children have learnt to swim. This valuable life skill is taught by a professional and has given children confidence in the water.</p> <p>This provision has given children the opportunity to make positive relationships and develop skills in public speaking team work and cooperation.</p> <p>Before the summer holiday children in receipt of the Pupil Premium grant are given specific resources, tailored to their needs. These are shared with parents so they know how to use these resources to support their child to be 'ready' for September.</p>

**Objectives**

**Raising Attainment**

To raise attainment and accelerate progress of pupils therefore narrowing the gap between

disadvantaged pupils and their peers.

- Fund a Pupil Premium Learning Mentor to work with individuals and groups to develop skills, knowledge, understanding and behaviours for learning
- For the summer term provide a teacher to support target children and their parents to make links between learning at home and at school
- Investigate the 'Read it' program with a view to buying this to support children to learn to read

### **Reducing Barriers to Learning**

To meet the personal, social and emotional (PSE) needs of the pupils to make room for learning to take place.

- Provide counselling for children with identified emotional barriers to learning
  - Family Worker support for families
  - Protective Behaviour Group
  - Develop behaviour for learning through targeted nurture groups
- Continue to build on current strategies to promote maximum parent involvement in children's learning

### **Enrichment**

To maximise access to experiences that widen children's knowledge and skills for life.

- Cost of school visits as appropriate
- Provision of school uniform including school shoes
- After school activity club place provision
